Badge Application – Theory Component

All Hockey Australia umpiring accreditations require the umpire to complete a theory component, to be completed online via the HockeyEd website.

To begin the accreditation process one must register with HockeyEd via the link - <http://hockeyed.hockey.org.au/login/index.php>

When registered, you will have access to all courses available from HockeyEd (including Umpire, Coach and Technical Official).

Hockey Australia would like to welcome you to the national coach and umpire accreditation training programs, collectively known as HockeyEd.

The programs continue to operate within the Australian Sports Commission's (ASC) National Officiating Accreditation Scheme (NOAS) and National Coaching Accreditation Scheme (NCAS), and replaces the old coach and umpire 'courses'. The Umpire Coach and Technical Official accreditation courses continue under the old structure and are currently being reviewed.

Hockey Australia has undertaken an extensive research, review and consultation process in creating the new HockeyEd programs to develop an accreditation structure that meets the needs of all modern hockey participants. The new HockeyEd umpire and coach training programs are competency based and are designed to reflect the modern game and the needs of hockey participants. These programs will see a shift in the focus towards developing practical skills and self-development, and thus ensure coaches and umpires are better prepared to meet the demands of the game.

The HockeyEd accreditation programs are open to those candidates who can be assessed within the Australian hockey environment. The programs will be delivered in a combination of formats including online learning, practical sessions, self-development activities and workshop training.

The Community Umpire Training Program is designed to train umpires in the basic concepts of umpiring including umpiring roles and responsibilities; applying the basic hockey rules; safety and enjoyment.

It is an enjoyable and straightforward training program involving an online learning session, an applied learning quiz and a practical evaluation. The program is directed towards players, parents, teachers and other new umpires who are involved in Hook in2 Hockey, modified versions of the game or lower level club hockey.

The Community Umpire training program can be accessed as an educational resource for currently accredited individuals, as well as being a training requirement for those wishing to obtain their Community Umpire Accreditation.

Level 1 Umpire

The Level 1 Umpire Training Program is designed to train umpires in the fundamental concepts of umpiring including fitness, positioning, signals and ensuring the safety and enjoyment of players.

It is an enjoyable and convenient training program involving an online learning session, an applied learning quiz, a 1 day practical course and a practical evaluation. The program is directed towards parents, players and umpires who are involved in umpiring club hockey, Intra-state Championships and low level National Championships.

The Level 1 Umpire training program can be accessed as an educational resource for currently accredited individuals, as well as being a training requirement for those wishing to obtain their Level 1 Umpire Accreditation
