

Expired Badges

From the 2016 season, only umpires who hold a current **HockeyEd Accreditation** will be eligible for umpiring payments from BHA.

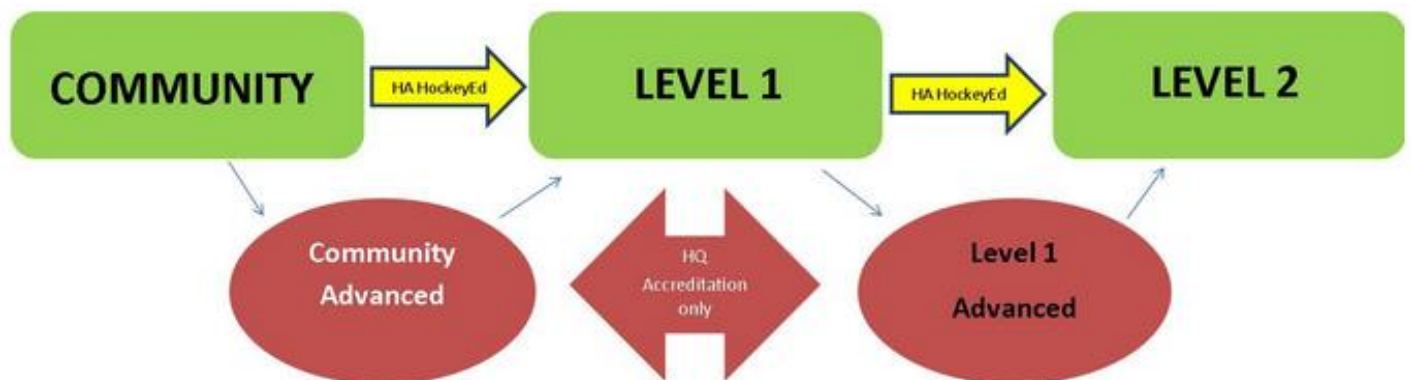
What is HockeyEd?

HockeyEd is the national coach and umpire accreditation scheme driven by Hockey Australia. The programs continue to operate within the Australian Sports Commission's (ASC) National Officiating Accreditation Scheme (NOAS) and National Coaching Accreditation Scheme (NCAS), and replaces the old coach and umpire 'courses'.

The new HockeyEd umpire and coach training programs are competency based, and include a "theory component" done by the participants in their own time, and a "practical component" (assessment) completed by the participant with an accredited assessor – this can be achieved during BHA fixtures, State Championships or external BHA programs.

What are the badges?



HockeyEd (Hockey Australia) Badges include

HA Community,
HA Level 1, and
HA Level 2.

Hockey Queensland have devised two interim badges to assist with the progression of an umpire's development. These include;

HQ Community Advanced, and
HQ Level 1 Advanced.

The theory components relative to the Hockey Queensland badges, are the HockeyEd badges preceding them. I.e. to achieve a Community Advanced (HQ), one must have completed the theory component of the Community (HA), and to achieve a Level 1 Advanced (HQ), one must have completed the theory component of the Level 1 (HA).

BHA has aligned with the above umpiring accreditation pathway, and recognises both HA & HQ badges.

How do these badges relate to the BHA Competition?

I have an outdated badge, what's my next step?

Update your accreditation via the HockeyEd system*. To give you an idea of how your outdated badge aligns with the new accreditations, see the table below.

***You will be required to complete the theory component online via the HockeyEd website. Level 1 and Level 2 courses require a \$40 registration fee. BHA will reimburse all participants of this registration fee once their accreditation is complete, and upon proof of receipt.**

I've registered with HockeyEd and completed the online component, now what?

Once you've completed the online component, you will have access to your "Practical Checklist" – a blank PDF document.

Print, fill in your details, and advise BHA – umpires@bha.org.au. Let us know;

- what badge you previously had,
- what HockeyEd badge you've registered for, and
- what division you regularly umpired during the 2015 season.

BHA will determine based on the information above if you'll be required to complete a practical assessment, to complete your badge accreditation. For most regular umpires, your allocations this year will be used as your practical assessment for HockeyEd.
